



PATIENT ASSISTED TRAVEL SCHEMES (PATS)

Patient Assisted Travel Schemes (PATS) provide people in rural areas of Australia with financial assistance towards the costs of travelling to, and staying near, specialist medical services for treatment. The scheme is run by each state and territory, which is why the financial assistance differs according to location.

BCNA has concerns about the adequacy of the state and territory programs to meet the needs of people who require assistance with travel and accommodation costs. To read further about BCNA's work in this area visit bcna.org.au.

This fact sheet provides information about each state and territory scheme, and where to find more details. The websites for each state and territory scheme (provided in the table) will give you the most up-to-date information, so we suggest that you check these regularly to see if there are any changes that apply to you.

Most schemes require that you keep your receipts as proof that you had travel expenses. It is a good idea for you to hold onto all receipts for any travel and accommodation expenses you incur in case you need them to support your claim later on.

Commercial accommodation refers to accommodation that is registered as a business, for example, hotels, motels, and caravan parks. Private accommodation refers to accommodation at a private residence, for example, the home of a family member or friend.
